COVID-19 GUIDELINES

Our team has worked hard to prepare for our summer camp opening on July 6th! New COVID-19 procedures are in place, as well as awesome curriculum and staff that are extremely excited to see the campers. We constantly monitor the decisions and recommendations from Atlantic County and the Center for Disease Control (CDC) for any updates.

NEW PROCEDURES

This document is a summary of the safety standards and programming procedures that Bright Stars Summer Camps will be following for Summer 2020. It is subject to change based on updated information and recommendations from local, state and federal authorities.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING PROCEDURES

- Children will remain in small groups, no more than 9 campers per staff member. We will keep the same children and camp leaders together throughout the day.
- Each group will have their own lunch time to ensure the social distancing.
- Camp staff will use non-contact forms of enthusiasm; for example, air high-fives.
- We designed a clear gym layout with physical distancing markers to provide social distancing for our camp leaders and campers.

SCREENING PROCEDURES FOR ALL STAFF AND CAMPERS

As campers and staff arrive, prior to entering camp, a designated Bright Stars staff member will take temperatures using a no-touch thermometer, and ask screening questions. If the staff or camper does not meet the criteria necessary, they will not be permitted into camp.

DETAILS:

- Screening Questions- Bright Stars staff will ask each person (or caregiver on their behalf) if they had any of the following symptoms in the past 24 hours:
 - fever, cough, difficulty breathing, other signs of illness
 - any exposure to another individual with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19
- Temperatures- Bright Stars staff will take camper and staff temperatures with a no-touch thermometer. The temperature must be under 100 degrees to enter camp. The temperatures will not be recorded or said out loud.

HEALTH AND ILLNESS PROCEDURES

- We will provide frequent opportunities throughout the day, in addition to before and after lunch and after bathroom trips, for hand-washing or hand sanitizing for staff and children. Campers will sanitize their hands between each camp station.
- If anyone has a temperature 100.4 degrees or higher while at camp, they will be moved into an isolated location immediately and the family will be notified to come pick up their child.
- We will monitor staff and campers throughout the day for any signs of possible illness.
- Staff will be trained on new screening procedures.
- We will ask and remind campers to use tissues to wipe their nose and to cough inside their elbow.
- Use of masks will be determined by state guidelines prior to the start of summer camp.

EQUIPMENT USAGE AND CLEANING

- We have removed any equipment that is not in full use to guarantee that we are capable of cleaning surfaces after they are used. Equipment will be frequently sanitized between each camp group.
- We have removed small camp props that are unable to be easily disinfected.
- We will immediately clean and disinfect surfaces after each group has lunch.
- We will pre-prep arts and crafts activities for individual children to easily pick up, limiting cross contamination.
